← Who is the Program for?

- Post-Master's social workers interested in developing advanced clinical skills in work with the elderly in a range of health care settings.

← What is the Fellowship Program?

A ten month, part time (32 hours/week) Program that includes:

- In-depth clinical work.... Treat geriatric patients in a variety of hospital, ambulatory and community settings that form the continuum of care for the elderly.
- Academic exposure..... Participate in lectures, teaching rounds and continuing education courses offered at Beth Israel Deaconess Medical Center, a Harvard Medical School teaching hospital.
- Scholarly writing Create a publishable, professional paper utilizing a writing coach who guides the process.

← What is the philosophy of the Fellowship?

- Embracing a model of adult learning, the Fellowship trains social workers who will assume clinical and programmatic leadership roles in the field of aging.

← Is there a stipend for the Fellowship?

- Stipend of \$20,000 is paid to the Fellow.
