WHAT'S NEW IN EDUCATION

We welcomed **Dr. Phillip Pierorazio**, Chief of Urology at Penn Presbyterian Hospital as our William C. DeWolf Visiting Professor in April. Dr. Pierorazio spoke on "Mindful Approach to Surgical Complications" and "Contemporary Management of Upper Tract Urothelial Cancer".

The narrated video, "Hybrid Pelvic Fascia Sparing Radical Prostatectomy," and other advanced robotic urologic surgery videos, are meant to serve as an educational resource for colleagues and students.

Led by **Dr. Heidi Rayala**, the division kicked off spring with a department-wide PACE (Personal and Company Effectiveness) assessment, aimed at understanding the work and communication styles of colleagues with the ultimate goal of fostering productive end empathetic work relationships.



The Division of Urology at BIDMC hosted another urology bootcamp event this July. The program has continued to grow, with 28 first-year urology residents from 10 New England Urology programs in attendance this year. Organized by faculty member **Dr. Rus Korets** with assistance from faculty members Drs. Marissa Kent, Shaun Wason (BIDMC), George Haleblian and Marty Kathrins (Brigham and Women's Hospital), and Piruz Motamedinia (Yale School of Medicine) and BIDMC Urology Residents, the program provided attendees with lectures on urologic emergencies, trauma, and common urologic procedures that interns will encounter during their training. The attendees then had an opportunity to rotate through multiple simulations to help them practice handson techniques such as cystoscopy, suprapubic catheter placements, and flexible ureteroscopy.

Dr. Rus Korets was awarded a grant from the Society of Academic Urology to develop a point of care ultrasound curriculum in urology residency program, as part of a collaborative effort with Dr. Ryan Steinberg and the University of Iowa Department of Urology. 
WHAT'S NEW IN PRACTICE
