- Christensen's topology of questions: "First, the exploratory questions: What are the 'facts'? Then, the challenge or testing questions: Are these solutions or interpretations adequate to the problem? Next, the contextual and relational questions, the 'weaving devices' that at once broaden the perspective of the class and begin the process of tying things together: How is this solution like that solution?" "Then come the 'priority' questions: Which is the best solution? Why? Finally, the concluding and conceptualizing questions: what have we learned? What are the principles involved in the choices we made? How do they relate to choices we've made in previous classes? Material from Adena Rosmarin The Art of Leading a Discussion.
