NARRATIVE REPORT

I am a general internist and clinical and health services researcher with broad interests in obesity, health disparities and primary care research. A major line of inquiry in my early career was to draw attention to the growing problem of obesity and the low priority placed by clinicians nationally especially among vulnerable populations. In a series of high profile studies in JAMA, I documented the low rate of exercise counseling nationally and identified patients with disability, smokers, immigrants, and older adults as at particularly high risk for obesity and poor health behaviors. This work, in part, contributed to the greater public health and clinical focus on the problem of obesity and has spawned interventions targeted at promoting behavior change. Another major focus of my work has been in identifying disparities in care experienced by persons with obesity and to identify this group as an underserved population. I published a seminal paper in the Annals of Internal Medicine documenting that women with obesity were less likely to receive recommended cancer screening than thinner women even after accounting for differences in illness burden, healthcare access, and socioeconomic differences. Interestingly, obesity-related lower rates of screening were observed primarily among Caucasian women but not among African American women. My subsequent work has documented disparities in other health arenas; adults with obesity were more likely to have undiagnosed diabetes and report lower satisfaction with ambulatory care. This work has led to a growing awareness of the potential harms posed by social bias and has led to efforts to improve preventive care in patients with obesity.

Much of my current work focuses on how health outcomes might vary across different patient populations and the importance of understanding patients' preferences and perspectives with regard to obesity and weight loss. The overarching objective of this work is to help clinicians prioritize and approach the care of patients with obesity without stigmatizing or alienating patients. Using an innovative application of health utility theory and methods, I quantified the value of weight loss from the patient's perspective and in doing so demonstrated that 1) many primary care patients value modest weight loss and are willing to risk death to sustain even a 10% reduction in weight -- challenging the widely held belief by many clinicians that patients are not interested in pursuing modest weight loss; 2) the greater importance of quality of life (QOL) factors over other clinical factors in driving diminished utility or patient well-being; 3) the relative importance of some QOL domains (e.g. social stigma) over others in affecting well-being; and finally 4) that scores on QOL health status measures can be misleading. QOL domains with the strongest correlations with patients' health utility are not always or typically the ones with the lowest absolute scores; moreover, scores on individual QOL domains often contribute more to explaining patients' diminished well-being than overall scores.

In addition to racial variation in obesity-related adverse consequences, racial minorities are much less likely to undergo weight treatment particularly bariatric or weight loss surgery (WLS). My current work also tries to understand whether this variation reflects a health disparity vs. differences in patient preferences or both. My most recent work examines patient's preference in decision-making around WLS as well as the outcomes of WLS and how much these outcomes are valued from the patient's perspective. I found that African American (AA) primary care patients who are medically eligible for WLS were less like to have seriously considered WLS; however, this was in large part explained by higher QOL rather than differences in weight loss preferences, clinical factors, or financial barriers. My work was also the first to directly and prospectively measure the value derived by patients after WLS by assessing changes in health utility over time.

My research has been recognized at the regional and national levels. I am the recipient of the 2004 Clinician-Investigator Award by the New England Chapter of SGIM and the 2011 Mid-Career Research and Mentorship Award by the national SGIM. I was also inducted into the American Society for Clinical Investigation in 2012. I have served on several national scientific committees including at the NIH and USDA as well as for professional organizations including The Obesity Society and the Society of General Internal Medicine (SGIM). I chaired the SGIM research committee and served on several SGIM research award committees. I previously served on the Weight Loss Surgery Expert Panel II for the Betsy Lehman Center for Patient Safety and Medical Error Reduction in Massachusetts where I chaired the Patient Education and Informed Consent Task Group; our recommendations were published in the journal *Obesity*. Finally, I am a former Deputy Editor of the Journal of General Internal Medicine (JGIM) and now serve of the editorial board.

In addition to conducting my own research, I am active in research training and hold several leadership roles. Since 2001, I have mentored over 30 trainees in a broad array of content areas within research. In 2006, I was named Co-Site Director of the Harvard General Internal Medicine Fellowship Program based at BIDMC and in 2012 became one of two Directors of the Harvard-wide program which oversee the research training of 10-15 fellows each year across 6 Harvard-affiliated academic sites. I also co-lead and oversee our Division's research section which is comprised of 12 core research faculty who collectively lead an annual research budget of 10 million. In these roles, I am engaged in mentorship and strategic planning that contribute to the ongoing success of our trainees and faculty and our research enterprise. I have been honored by several awards for my mentorship including awards by BIDMC, Harvard Medical School (Barger Award), and SGIM. Under my co-leadership, our research section was awarded the inaugural HMS Program Award for a Culture of Excellence in Mentoring (PACEM) in 2016.

Finally, I am a practicing general internist and spend 15-20% of my time caring for a panel of 200 patients at Healthcare Associates, Beth Israel Deaconess Medical Center's hospital-based academic primary care practice. The practice of clinical medicine and my relationships with patients informs my research and provide me with immense professional satisfaction.
